

NETWORKING EVENT INSIDE CLASS ZERO EMISSION



On Wednesday April 29th, 2009, the [Flemish Government's department of Economy, Science and Innovation](#) organized an afternoon of networking within the framework of a science communication action plan. As co-organizer of the meeting, the International Polar Foundation made its pedagogical workshop "[Class Zero Emission](#)" available for the occasion. All organisations active in science communication and popularization in Flanders were invited to the event.

After a short presentation by IPF's science education manager, Sandra Vanhove, an introduction to the "zero emission" concept of the [Princess Elisabeth Station](#) in Antarctica was given by project coordinator, Johan Berte. The documentary "Station Princess Elisabeth: Building the Future" was shown to the public to illustrate the Station's scientific context. Prof. Hugo Declerck then added a basic overview about the scientific research to be undertaken at the Princess Elisabeth Station, before the meeting was rounded off by IPF pedagogical officer Isabelle Dufour with an explanation on "Class Zero Emission" and a detailed tour of the workshop.
